

Community Guidelines

- Everyone makes mistakes. If someone uses discriminatory language or expresses harmful ideas, address it with constructive criticism. If someone offers you criticism, we encourage you to be open to it and listen.
- **If you're unsure** whether your behavior is appropriate, ask it's better to ask too much than too little. "Yes" means "Yes"!
- If you feel that someone else needs help, don't leave it to others to take action. Instead, ask if and how you can offer support. Look out for each other.
- Don't try to determine someone's (social) gender based on their appearance. If a person shares their name and the gender-specific pronouns they prefer, do not try to correct them. Accept that the person knows best how they want to be addressed.
- All restrooms on the festival grounds are unisex. Please refrain from pointing out which restroom someone should use. This can be hurtful to the person involved.
- There are different types of disabilities. Some are invisible and not easily recognized by others. Please refrain from making judgments about a person's disability and avoid jumping to conclusions. We aim to be sensitive.
- Black people and other marginalized groups are not responsible for educating others. There are organizations that can provide you with useful informational materials, book recommendations, and links.
- We reserve the right to remove people who fail to adhere to these principles or exhibit discriminatory behavior from the grounds or event.
- We are all circus! We are all collectively responsible for ensuring that everyone feels comfortable here and for making this beautiful place what it is meant to be: a space for everyone, safe, vibrant, and inclusive.
